

Karger Publishers Policy on the Declaration of Competing Interests

Karger endorses the ICMJE recommendations on the '[Disclosure of Financial and Non-Financial Relationships and Activities, and Conflicts of Interest](#)'. According to this recommendation "The potential for conflict of interest and bias exists when professional judgment concerning a primary interest (such as patients' welfare or the validity of research) may be influenced by a secondary interest (such as financial gain). Perceptions of conflict of interest are as important as actual conflicts of interest."

Editors must declare to the Publisher any relationship or activity that could be perceived as potentially interfering with a full and objective evaluation of a manuscript or with their role as a member of the Editorial Board. Any of the following must be declared:

- Financial interests relevant to the manuscript they are handling that occurred in the last 5 years.
- Collaboration or co-authorship with one of the authors of a manuscript they are handling in the last 5 years.
- A Current, or in the last three years, shared affiliation with one of the authors of a manuscript they are handling.
- Any other relationships, including beyond the above timeframes, that could be perceived as a potential conflict of interest.
